**CUB SCOUTS . . . JOIN TC, BALOO AND AKELA!**

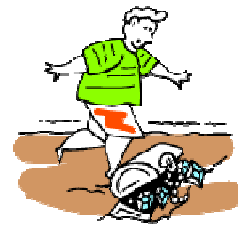

### FRIDAY NIGHT TREASURE HUNT!

Once Cub Scouts and families have checked in and set up their tents, adventure awaits them in the **capitol grounds treasure hunt**. Stop by the tepee in the Cub Scout camping area and pick up the treasure hunt form and map for your adventure. Clues will help Cubs and families learn more about North Dakota history and the natural surroundings of the state capitol grounds. All completed treasure hunt forms can be entered for a prize drawing. This event will be held on Friday night only.



## AKELA'S WOODS

Saturday will be a full day of activities for Cub Scouts and families. Akela's Woods will host **games, crafts, BB guns, archery range** and other activities. **Fish painting on T-shirts, pop bottle bird feeders will be the craft projects—fish painting in the morning and pop bottle feeders in the afternoon.** BB guns and archery will be featured in the morning and afternoon sessions. The games area will feature different games in each session—featuring games Cub Scouts would have played over the past 100 years.



# EGG DROP AND WORLD'S LONGEST PINEWOOD DERBY

## EGG DROP

Cub Scouts can sharpen their engineering skills by preparing a container for the “eggciting” drop to be conducted in front of the North Dakota State Capitol. The rules are simple but the excitement is contagious!!

### EGG DROP RULES:

- Participants must be Cub Scouts
- Raw egg is to be provided by the Cub Scout—cannot be wrapped in tape or coated in glue and/or latex cement or other material that will prevent the judges from checking for cracked eggs!
- No Parachute Designs
- Dropping a live chicken is NOT permitted! You must make your own container.
- All material for container and inside padding to be supplied by Cub Scout. Suggestions include jello, cooked pasta, popcorn, crushed newspapers, plastic or Styrofoam peanuts—use your imagination.
- The largest container size allowed is 6” X 6” X 6”.
- Each package must be clearly marked with the Cub Scout’s name, hometown and pack number.
- All boxes will be inspected before the drop—to make sure the box is secure and ready for drop.
- Drop will be conducted by the Egg Drop staff.
- Boxes will be opened after drop to check if egg survived the drop or if it is ready for the frying pan!
- Decision of the egg drop judges is final.
- Egg drops will be conducted throughout Saturday. Specific times will be posted at the Cub Scout camping area as well as the entrance to Akela’s Woods.

### Contests for the Egg Drop event:

Prizes will be awarded for the following contestants

1. **Smallest device**  
This award will be given to the smallest device that successfully completes the Egg Drop. Maximum size is 12” X 12”.
2. **Scouting Spirit**  
This award will be given to the device that shows the best Scouting Spirit. This design does NOT need to successfully complete the Egg Drop.
3. **Best Design**  
This award will be given to the device with the most unique/original design that successfully completes the Egg Drop.

*There will be a different winner for the three additional contests.*
